

# Christmas Day



In our collective experience, few things can rival the excitement of paragraphs unwrapping presents around the tree on Christmas morning! But

contrary to those Christmas legends, gifts don't just magically appear during the night before Christmas, do they? A lot of effort, and sometimes a lot of angst, goes into Christmas shopping. What's an appropriate gift? How much should I spend? It needs to be enough to show my affection, but not embarrassingly over-the-top. Ideally when exchanging with our peers, we want to reciprocate with something of roughly equivalent value. It's protocol. That's a lot of pressure!

Confession time. When I was a kid, I would regularly exchange gifts with my best friend Kelly. In the 4th or 5th grade, I remember being stumped about what to give him. Nothing seemed quite right, so I was empty-handed when he delivered his present to me on the last day of school. I had to respond quickly, but with what? So I did the unthinkable (which we've all thought of before, admit it). I peeked inside his package to see what he was giving me. It was one of those telescoping pens, like an extendable antenna with a ball-point pen on the end. Oh no! He had found the perfect cheap gift for a 10 year-old boy! It could fit in your pocket, but then be stretched out for use as a pointer, a poker, a sword. How could I, on my modest budget, match a gift like that? But I did, exactly. I rushed out and bought him one just like it, then pretended like we just happened to think of the same clever gift. (Not saying I'm proud of it, but I was 10. Cut me some slack.)

This whole gift-matching scheme pretty much crumbles when we consider what we should give to God this Christmas. There's no matching His gift to us. But it is Jesus' birthday, after all, not ours. Shouldn't He be on the top of our list? One good way to give to Jesus is through the Missions Offering. He doesn't personally need our money or our extendable pens, but I'm quite sure He is pleased when we support missionaries, feed the hungry, and start new ministries. Some folks have told me they give to the offering as if Jesus was a family member. Others have said they give an equivalent to what they spend on the whole family! Sound extravagant? It may seem like it at first, but you can't out-give God, can you? With whatever measure you use, I urge you to be generous in helping to share the love of Christ around the world. Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).
