November, the month of Thanksgiving, is upon us. And to be certain, we all have pienty of reasons to be thankful, particularly to the God who created us, redeemed us, and sustains us. If you and I made a

list of blessings, they wouldn't be identical, but would have at least some similarities—possibly including a loving family, good friends, a church home, an eternal hope, a warm house, too much food, and some degree of financial security and/or physical health.

But as I look around the world, I'm aware that not everyone is as blessed as I am, and much of the misfortune has nothing to do with hurricanes, droughts, and other acts of nature. People can be awfully cruel to people. The world around us suffers from wars, crime, abuse, neglect and injustice. I see it, and I am saddened, and yet at the same time thankful that my little corner of the world is pretty safe and stable. But then, in a moment of thought, I grasp something else to be thankful for.

A story I once read has stuck with me. I've long since forgotten the source, so I'm sharing this with you from my frail memory, hoping it has maintained the gist of the original: One evening while walking in the community, a minister had the unfortunate experience of being mugged. It shook him up considerably, as we might imagine, and the news spread quickly through the parish. On Sunday morning, he felt he needed to speak about what had happened. Instead of calling for fire and brimstone upon the perpetrators, or bemoaning the sorry state of society, he approached it a different way. He admitted to his congregation that it was a traumatic event, but then went on to share that it had made him keenly grateful for three particular things. "First," he said, "I am thankful that I've been privileged to have something worth stealing. And second, I'm thankful that the thieves took just my wallet, and not my life. And finally," he said, "I am thankful it was I who was mugged, and not I who did the mugging."

When was the last time I felt thankful for going the day without stealing anything, or hurting someone's feelings, or telling a lie? I'm reminded of the saying, "There, but for the grace of God, go I." If there is any good within me, I didn't put it there; God did! It is His grace that transforms us and makes us holy. And so in gratitude, let us exercise that goodness at every opportunity. Let us be a blessing to a world that is hurting. We know we can't repay God for all He has done, but we are able to honor and thank Him by helping others. It's the least we can do.
